# UPLIFT Newsletter

As the story goes, renowned theologian Karl Barth was at Rockefeller Chapel on the campus of the University of Chicago during a lecture tour in 1962. During a Q and A time, a student asked him if he could summarize his whole life's work in theology in one sentence. Barth responded, "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so." There is power and truth in the songs we learn as children. At the time they are cute little ditties, but as we mature in faith they remind us of the essentials of the nature of God.

Another such song goes, "Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world. Red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in his sight. Jesus loves the little children of the world." Chances are you have fond memories of standing in front of the congregation singing that song with all your heart, because you believed it to be true. But for too many, the purity and innocence of that proclamation has faded. I know it has for me, and that is something I'm not proud of.

I'd like to say I'm not racist and I show no prejudice, but as I look at myself in the mirror, I know it's a lie. When I have to call my credit card company, I do it between 8 and 4 because if I call after hours, I get stuck talking to someone overseas (and I'm sure if they access my information, they'll misuse it.) When I'm on an elevator and some young people of a different race get on, my right hand goes on my right pocket to make sure my wallet doesn't go missing. When I'm in an urban area and I see some kids messing around, I remember when I was 14 catching some kids in the church vandalizing the vestibule with a fire extinguisher and turning it on me. Life experiences have tainted my "colorless" perception. While you will never see me at a march, and I would hope you would never hear any hate speech come from my lips—I'll be the first to admit that I have allowed ethnicity, race and economic status to tinge my perception of life. But before you judge me for my confession, I would challenge you to look into your mirror.

I may not love all the "little children" of the world, but I know that God does. "Red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in his sight." That's the thing about God's love, it is unconditional and consistently pure. In Genesis we are taught that all people are created in the image of God. That means that a part of God abides in me, and in everyone around me—no more, no less. Just as the parent of twelve children has the capacity to love each of them as much as the parent of one child loves theirs, so God has the capacity to love each and every person who is, and ever was, and ever will be. I was, as the Psalmist declared, "fearfully and wonderfully made, knit together in my mother's womb by God's hand." That intimacy makes me special in the eyes of God, but no more special than anyone else. While I am "precious in God's sight," I am no more or less precious than that little girl who was born into poverty in Ethiopia five thousand years ago, or that little boy who will be born on a space colony two thousand years from now. God's heart welcomes me as much as it welcomes Mother Theresa and a penitent mass murderer. The privilege I have enjoyed my entire life is not an entitlement to special position in the kingdom, it is rather a responsibility to be about the work of the kingdom, the work of healing and justice and peace.

Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of Heaven." God's kingdom transcends the worldly issues of race and ethnicity and social status. No matter how we define ourselves, God sees each of us as an equal part of his family. And any attempt to exclude another is a blatant exclusion of him. Being found in Christ, may we see with the eyes of Christ, through the lense of love. No matter how we may be different, may we see that in the most important things, the things of faith, we are alike—and in that we are truly one.....

## A 300th Reflection

Old Stone Presbyterian Church in Lewisburg, WV, is thought to be the oldest church building in continuous use west of the Allegheny Mountains. Originally named Lewisburg Presbyterian Church, the church's sanctuary on Church Street was built in 1796 from native limestone, with walls 22 inches thick. The church escaped damage during the Civil War, when it was used as a hospital and sleeping quarters for troops.
