Before the Halloween candy can be discounted, we hear Bing Crosby crooning, "City sidewalks, busy sidewalks, dressed in holiday style, in the air there's a feeling of Christmas...." You know that feeling, we all know that feeling. For some it's the decorative bling, for others it's the songs that we sing. For some it's the nostalgia of days gone by when times were easier (or at least they seemed to be). For others it's a matter of keeping the traditions alive as if to prove to ourselves that while times are changing, we need not be. It is a feeling sparked by our senses, a smell, a sound, a sight embedded in our memory. But sentimentality can only take us so far. While the feeling of Christmas is grounded in what was, its true beauty comes in where its taking us—in what will be.

The feeling of Christmas is best described by the light of the Advent candles—hope, peace, joy and love. These four gifts are at the heart of the Christian message and at the center of a Christian life. The Season of Advent begins the Christian year and so it is appropriate that we celebrate these life giving qualities of our faith.

The word Advent comes from the Latin meaning "to come." It marks the arrival of a notable person, thing or event. As a people of faith we celebrate the coming of Christ in three different ways. We look back and remember the birth of Jesus, the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy. From the beginning of time, God assured his people that he would not leave them desolate, empty as a consequence of their sin. God promised that he would not have us abandoned, orphaned with no one to help. Into the darkness he would bring a light, a light so strong that the darkness could not overcome it. And that promise has been the source of our hope, for in the coming of Jesus we see that God is true to his word, the word made flesh that dwells among us.

We remember that Jesus was born in Bethlehem, but so too in this season of Advent we celebrate that he is born in our hearts. In an echo of Isaiah's prophecy, an angel tells Joseph, "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel—which means, God is with us." The presence of Jesus was not relegated to an ancient time and place. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, Jesus is just as alive in us today giving us peace in our every circumstance. Therein we find our confidence in our daily walk. It is the peace that passes all understanding, keeping, guarding our hearts and minds in the knowledge of Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:7)

Jesus came to this earth. Jesus lives in our hearts today. Jesus will come again. This Season of Advent points beyond what was and is to what will be. Life is a daily battle—it always has been. Jesus says, "In this world you will have trouble, but fear not, for I have overcome the world." The joy of our faith is that our trials are but for a time. As Jesus returns, he will execute his justice, setting free those who have been wrongly held back, lifting up those who have been oppressed, making known the truth tainted by liars, making right the wrongs of the ages. And joy shall fill the land, and hearts shall overflow with gladness for when all this world has fallen God's truth stands eternal.

The hope of God's promise fulfilled, the peace of God's abiding presence, the joy of what shall be for those who, through their faith, have been redeemed, all this celebrates the love which is God in all his glory. It kind of makes fruit cake and egg nog look trivial doesn't it.

In the air you breath through this journey we call Advent, may you sense the true feeling of Christmas. As the day arrives may you experience in some new and fuller way an understanding of God's loving desire for you.....

I have attended funerals for friends and co-workers, as well as my brother-in-law, my mother-in-law, my nephew, my last aunt, my last uncle.

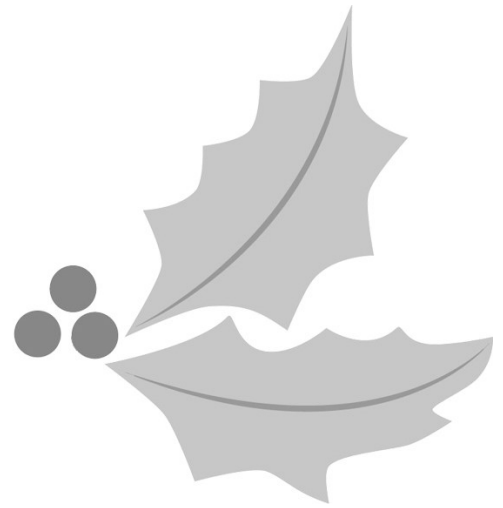
**God loves me, God loves everyone in the world.**
