Sermon Outline

Jesus' Visit to Nazareth Is an Epiphany

1. Following Jesus' baptism and temptation He began to teach and preach and His reputation began to spread. He returned to His hometown, went to the synagogue, read the scripture and said, "Today, this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." The people were amazed.

2. Jesus knew their thoughts. They wanted Him to do miracles there. Jesus said, "No prophet is accepted in his hometown." And He used examples of Elijah and Elisha.

3. Jesus' loyalty was to God, to follow God's lead that God's Word and grace might be extended to <u>all</u> people.

4. His statements seem to be presumptuous if not blasphemous to the people and they chased Him hoping to hurl Him off a cliff.

5. Jesus passed through the midst of them and went on His way.

6. Jesus held to His convictions, guided by and expressed the will of God for all people. He could not allow anything to dissuade Him or coax Him to veer from His mission.

7. The stage is set for Jesus' crucifixion as Jesus' ministry is misunderstood, experienced as threatening to the status quo and seen to be arrogant or blasphemous.

8. Jesus manifests Himself to be the Messiah, the fulfillment of God's promise to redeem the world, knowing that to follow this mission will cost Him everything, even His life. He realized that His allegiance to God would demand His all. Yet Jesus stayed true to God!

9. Would anything less than our Lord's resolute conviction to follow God's will, suffice?

10. Knowing that Jesus did follow God's will for His life, even to the cross for our redemption, can our response be anything less than to follow Him in faith and trust?

11. Pray that God's Spirit gives us the courage to live our lives as witnesses to the redeeming grace that Jesus reveals to us.
