MISSION MOMENT - Afghanistan

A Christian woman from the United States visited an Afghan organization that had set up orphanages for the daughters of those massacred by the Taliban four years earlier. They talked for hours about their lives and different worlds. The girls were eager to share dreams of their future and the vision of a democratic Afghanistan safe for all, especially women and children. When they asked the woman why she had come, she replied: "There are people in my church who want to know about your lives. I came to learn." The next question took her by surprise. "Why are you a Christian?" asked one the adults who had been sitting quietly in the back of the room filled with children and youth. "I love Jesus because he is the only religious leader I know who, when addressing how a man should deal with lust when looking at a woman, said that the man should put out his own eye. He doesn't tell women to cover or hide to avoid a man's gaze but tells men to pluck out their eyes if necessary." The air in the room immediately shifted. It was as if everyone had just drawn in a quick breath. Every face in the room lit up. Heads nodded. Astonished and inquisitive smiles marked every countenance. The conversation went on, but everything had changed. They all knew that they had a new friend and advocate for their safe and free future.
