MISSION MOMENT – *Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary*

A wise mentor once told me that God is often slow . . . but never late. I have found this to be truer nowhere more than in my own life. Perhaps one of the most important ways God has shaped me over time (that is, acted slowly) is through the communities of faith that have surrounded me along the way. While my first two years at Austin Seminary were great, they included challenge—deaths and cancer diagnoses in my family, among other things. I became very disheartened and frustrated; I had felt called to seminary but now couldn't focus on my studies—or anything else. One day, I approached several women and asked if they would be interested in gathering regularly. This community has carried me through to this day—and I look forward to my future graduation and ordination, when they will rejoice with me. After my first two years at Austin, I took a break to serve as a PC(USA) Young Adult Volunteer in Guatemala. Missing my core group back home, I struggled with the emotional stress of my work with children and older adults living in poverty. But, remembering the impact of my community back at

seminary, I reached out to my fellow YAVs. That year, as we struggled and rejoiced with each other, we were reminded of how overwhelmingly present the Holy Spirit is when two or three are gathered. I am thankful for the PC(USA), I am thankful for my community at Austin Seminary, I am thankful for my fellow YAVs, and I am thankful that God is often slow . . . but never late!
