### MISSION MOMENT- Self-Development of People

Vegetable farmers in the small community of Trio Village needed help. Living in Belize, they would time and time again plant their crops, only to be defeated. One time it would be plant diseases that ruined their crops; the next time, an infestation of pests, or too much rain, or too little rain. The villagers counted on the crops in order to eat, but the cost of failure was high. The Cooperative and Agricultural Department of Belize's national government suggested that the Trio Village farmers build "tunnels" in which to grow their crops. The tunnel technique involves stretching clear plastic over a frame made of PVC, to create a "hoop house" that serves as a simple greenhouse. The hoop house provides an ideal climate-controlled and pest- and disease-free environment for growing plants. Additionally, the hoop house extends the growing season for many extra months. To the farmers, it sounded like a miraculous idea. Unfortunately, they couldn't afford the materials to build the tunnels. On the verge of despair, the farmers heard about the Presbyterian Committee on Self-Development of People (SDOP), a ministry of the One Great Hour of Sharing. SDOP has been working intensively in Belize for several years, entering into partnerships with economically poor community groups who have a vision for how to change their circumstances but lack the financial resources to bring their dreams to life. With a grant from SDOP, the Trio Village farmers were able to build six hoop houses, which have dramatically enhanced the quality of life in the community: The farmers can now count on earning a livable wage from their efforts, and the community members are able to buy healthy food for a reasonable price.
