MISSION MOMENT- The Outreach Foundation

There is much talk about mission these days, about how mission is more than just a program of the church. In fact, many now speak of God as missionary and affirm that mission involves our very identity and purpose as followers of Jesus. Mission means not living for the sake of ourselves. When I think of congregations that understand this, I most often think of Presbyterian global partners.

Haidian Church is a large congregation with a creative ministry in an area of Beijing that features leading universities and many high-tech companies. It is the only church in a 430-square-kilometer area. Members of the pastoral staff, including Senior Pastor Wu and his wife, Pastor Ruth, lead the congregation with some 10,000 members and another 5,000 participants. They have six services each Sunday (one in English) and 58 meeting places. While there are 17 pastors serving the church and its preaching places, much of the work of the church is carried out by 700 lay leaders who receive training each Wednesday at the church. Pastor Wu, who is completing doctoral studies, has a special burden for strengthening the discipleship ministries of the congregation. "We have focused on building the church and baptizing new believers. Now, we need to disciple them." The majority of the church members are under 40 years old. Haidian Church averages 400–500 baptisms each year. The growth of the church, according to Rev. Wu, is driven by parents bringing their children to church, the life challenges that people are facing that set them upon a spiritual search, and the work of personal evangelism. It was interesting during a recent visit to see a group of members copying the Bible in beautiful Chinese script. Members are united around God's Word as they come together to copy the Bible by hand every six months! What a joy it is to be able to share with brothers and sisters in other cultures and contexts who have much to teach us about following Jesus and living for him in the world.
