### MISSION MOMENT – "Laundry Love" – a local ministry

For the past two years, St. Peter's Episcopal Church has been hosting a monthly "free laundry" service at the E&F Norge Laundromat on Walnut Street. After some startup publicity including a Blairsville newspaper article, the only folks who showed up at the first session were those who brought donations of laundry supplies and cash. However, word of mouth prevailed and people called to ask for details or just came with friends we were already serving. Since then we have served 14 families, averaging 3-4 each month. We have had some families move to other towns where local congregations have picked up their support. We have had some families with improved circumstances who no longer need our services – and they have stayed in touch with us and each other.

Although we served some temporarily homeless families, most are working but not earning a living wage or are on disability and cannot work. Doing laundry is expensive and not covered by social services. Most of our families have no car so they rely on others or come on foot using baby strollers or borrowed shopping carts to carry their laundry.

The ministry we offer there varies. Some just need a person to listen to them; some ask us for prayers; some ask to receive a blessing or communion or inquire about baptism; some need other help that we can often find for them by referring them elsewhere. Others just need a hug, a smile and some kind words of encouragement. We try to just be present for them while we are there and see where God's path takes us, not pushing any particular agenda or message.

We normally hold our monthly sessions on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month after services from about noon until 3 and post the dates/times on our church's Facebook page. We welcome volunteers any Sunday, for as little as an hour here and there. We welcome cash donations or laundry supplies (bring them to the laundromat or drop them at St. Peter's any Sunday between 10:15 am and noon).
