## INTERESTING HISTORY

If you ever wondered when the church started using offering envelopes to receive their tithes and offerings, this article published in the Blairsville Presbyterian newspaper in 1895 gives us some clues.

For the benefit of those who do not understand the method of conducting the financial affairs of the church we would publish the following brief outline:

The congregation has adopted the weekly envelope system of paying subscription for the support of our own church. These subscriptions are all thrown into one general fund in the church treasury, from which all the expenses of the congregation are paid. These include Pastors' Salaries, Poor Fund, S. S. Fund, General Assembly Fund, Communion Fund and Contingent Fund. The last is for organist's salary, sexton's wages, heating, lighting, taxes, repairs, water, etc. When you make your subscription please remember that it is for all these purposes. Subscription can be paid monthly or quarterly, but it suits much better to have it weekly as provided in the plan adopted by the congregation. your contribution in an envelope properly marked and drop into the collection box.

Often envelopes containing from 25 to 50 cents are dropped into the boxes with no name on them. Please be careful to write name, date and amount on each envelope, for without this the treasurer cannot give you credit. Envelopes for this purpose will be found in vestibules at the doors. We also have collection each evening to replenish our poor fund which is being drawn upon to an unusual extent at present.
