FOREWORD

This is the twenty-third annual Year Book issued by this congregation. The first one was printed in 1906. The Rev. William L. Barrett, D. D., was pastor at that time. The report shows a church membership of 405, and an average Sunday School attendance of 116.

The Year Book has been published each year since 1906 with the one exception of 1919. There are two anniversary editions, one in 1910, celebrating the fifth anniversary of Dr. Barrett's pastorate and the other in 1913 giving a record of the celebration of the ninetieth anniversary of the organization of the church which was celebrated in September 1912. This celebration was combined with the dedication of the new addition to the church building and the new pipe organ. The Rev. Michael M. McDivitt, D. D., was pastor at the time these improvements were made.

In presenting this Year Book it is intended that it shall serve not only a permanent record of the reports of the various phases of the church, but also as a handbook of information for use throughout the year. The lists of officers are those chosen to serve during the year ending March 31, 1930. In connection with the roll of contributors the accurate address is given as far as possible. The schedule of meetings gives the time for the regular appointments and meetings.

The financial reports are given in full so that each contributor may know the objects to which the money collected for the various funds is applied. In connection with the church secretary's financial report the question has been raised as to the meaning of some of the terms used. "Direct Payments" refers to the amount sent in by mail or paid directly at the church office. "Envelopes" designates the amount contributed through the use of the regular double pocket envelopes. "Loose collection" refers to the money placed on the collection plates without any special designation.

The pastor wishes to express his appreciation to the officers and members of the church and to the various organizations for the fine spirit of cooperation that has been manifest through the year. This explains the fact that many of the reports are better than they were last year. The better these reports become the more difficult it becomes to maintain the standard for the next year. We face this task now, but we believe it is possible to attain a greater measure of success in this next year than we have in the past. To this end let us work and pray.
