

Blairsville Women's College To Go at Sheriff's Sale

INDIANA, PA., May 16.—Among properties advertised for sheriff's sale here June 4, are the grounds and buildings of historic Blairsville Seminary, known in recent years as Blairsville College for Women. The school was organized more than 65 years ago and hundreds of women throughout Western Pennsylvania obtained their education there.

The institution opened in a private awelling in 1850. In 1851, \$7,000 was raised, the present site was bought and a three-story brick building crected. The school was conducted at a loss for several years and closed in June, 1913. The property has been in the hands of a trustee since then.

A probable purchaser of the old college is the Blairsville school board, which might use the grounds for a new borough school. Blairsville College was organized by the Rev. George Hill of Blairsville. The first principal was the Rev. Samuel Shepley, who is 1853 made the institution the equal of many of the present New England colleges for women. The last principal was Miss Caroline Hays. The Rev. Dr. S. B. Linhart, secretary of the University of Pittsburch, was head of the Blairsville institution at one time.
