It was a dark and stormy night, and with each bolt of lightning and crash of thunder, little Johnny grew more and more frightened. By about 1:00, he had mustered all the courage he had, but it wasn't enough. Jumping out of bed he ran down the hall to his parents' room. "Momma, this storm makes me scared." "Now, now Johnny, there's no need to be afraid, God is right there with you in your bed." "That's what you always tell me Momma, but I would feel a lot better if God had skin on."

Faith is somehow easier when God can be seen with the eye or heard with the ear or felt with a strong embrace. The Old Testament is filled with mighty images of God in heaven, grand and glorious, high and lifted up. While we can worship God in all his grandeur, we can not always relate to him. He is always there, but what brings us comfort is the knowledge that God is here. We seek to be in relationship with one who steps off his throne and into our daily lives. We want to know that God understands what its like in our humanity, because it is only such a God who understands me.

We call it the incarnation, God coming to us in the flesh, God feeling what we feel, God facing what we face. God hovering in the heavens inspires awe, but God choosing to come into our midst, becoming vulnerable, fills us with assurance and hope in the knowledge we are not and never will be left alone. It is the presence of God in the midst of the storm that brings courage and peace. It is the promise that we are in God's everlasting care that brings us joy, knowing that we have a secure future. It is in the act of God coming to us, taking the initiative to welcome us into relationship that assures us we are loved.

This Season of Advent is a time of hearing the ancient words that foretell of God promising to do a new thing in the world. It is a time of remembering how he came into our midst, not loudly and earth shatteringly, but rather humbly with a whisper. Yet ever so quietly Jesus sowed the seeds of his kingdom, not only telling us who God the Father is, but showing us who he is by loving us into someone new.

But Advent does not merely look back to what has been, it also broadens our vision of his return and the fruition of the fulness of his kingdom and all it holds for us. We celebrate the good news that Jesus will come again and in his Lordship stake his claim over us for all eternity. And in that promise we are ever mindful of the covenant into which we have been called and in which we live, that he will be our God and we will be his people and nothing in all creation can separate us from him or him from us.

The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it. No matter how stormy the night, know that a new day is dawning therefore we need not fear. God is not far off. God is as near as the beat of our heart, the tear in our eye, the sigh that passes our lip. O come, O come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel. Come, Lord Jesus, come and give us peace.



Because of the safety of the health environment, the pastor only provides home visits to those who take the initiative to invite him.
