When a friend of mine, Sam, received the title of "honorably retired", he knew he wasn't ready to settle into his easy chair with the TV remote in one hand and a box of chocolates on his lap. With a passion for ministry still burning in his soul, he followed God's call to volunteer chaplaincy at Torrance. Each week he would show up on the grounds with his Bible and his guitar and a message in his heart. While many of the residents would doze off after having eaten their lunch, they were wide awake when he started to strum some chords. "What hymn would you like to sing?" he would ask. And like clockwork they would reply, "Because He Lives." Be it Lent or Easter or the Fourth of July or Halloween, the chorus of that old Gaither standard stirred their soul.

Whether its being sung in a chapel on the grounds of a state hospital or in a cathedral in the heart of a major city, the words of that hymn bring a sense of hope, peace and joy. From the opening phrase, "God sent his Son" to the closing chorus, "because I know he holds the future" in our faith we are assured that we are in God's care and therefore we need not fear no matter what our circumstance.

We are beginning the new liturgical year. The world's calendar marks time from January to December. As Christians we mark time from Advent to Christ the King Sunday. We begin by looking back to the ancient promise of God that he would come and make himself known among us, his people. Each Lord's Day in our worship we hear the words of the prophets foretelling the story of God's gift of salvation, how the Lord will not forsake his children, but will come and abide with us. As each week the candles burn brighter, the darkness of life is pierced and our hope is renewed. As our hope is rekindled we rest assured in peace knowing without a doubt that God is in control. Even when we don't know which end is up, God says "fear not for your name is written, engraved, in the palm of his hand" (Isaiah 49:16). While the things of this world may try to snatch us away, God's grip is surer than those things that assail us. Therein such a peace, we can rest assured. And being found cradled in the arms of God there is joy, a joy that is more than a fleeting sense of happiness, it is a confidence that when all is said and done, God has the final word—and that word is "You are mine forever." In that word we are refreshed with the knowledge of God's love, a celebration that nothing will ever separate us from him (and if we are all in him, from one another).

"God sent his Son, they called him Jesus....How sweet to hold a newborn baby....And then one day I'll cross the river....I'll see the lights of glory and I'll know he lives." the watchwords of Advent are hope, peace, joy and love. They are given power because he lives, because he holds the future. Look back at the ways God has been true to his Word, in the annals of history but even more in the experiences of your life. At each twist and turn he has been there. Sense his presence in the circumstances you face today. The name, Emmanuel means "God with us". As we walk through the shadows where vision is dimmed, as we stumble in the darkness of the unknown, we are not alone. Just because we do not always see God clearly doesn't mean he is not there. And as he has been so he is. And as he is so shall he always be—faithful.

The Bible ends with the words, "Come, Lord Jesus." And that desire is where our faith begins.

Because he lives, I can face tomorrow,
Because he lives all fear is gone;
Because I know he holds the future,
And life is worth the living just because he lives.....
