After months of envisioning, researching and planning its hard to believe the celebration of our bicentennial is behind us. Dozens upon dozens of people stepped forward and rolled up their sleeves to make the event such a success. The leadership from within this congregation was encouraging to say the least, a statement of what can be done when we work together. I want to thank everyone who so generously gave of themselves to the cause of making our anniversary so memorable. We truly have "a goodly heritage."

But looking back and remembering is merely nostalgia if it does not enhance who we've become today, and even more who we are becoming in the future. I'm so appreciative of opportunities I had in my youth to travel abroad and experience other cultures. I look back with fond memory of the friendships I formed and know those encounters helped to form who I am today. Knowing first hand what life is like in other places helps me appreciate where I live now, and in that appreciation I have come to understand my responsibility to live out the lessons I've learned.

Peter's image of being "living stones built in a spiritual house" has served well as a metaphor of our life together. In the mystery of the new experience they came to find that the God of their youth was already here with the same faithfulness they had known. And in the strength and hope their faith afforded them, they forged a new life and persevered. Each generation finds itself facing a new frontier filled with challenges. The trials may be different but the foundation of faith holds fast anchoring us in the midst of the storm. The Psalms that brought courage to our fore parents echo in the midst of our struggles and the hymns of praise we offer bring glory to the God of the ages.

It is good to look back with a grateful heart, but so too we are called to look ahead with a focused sense of purpose. Scripture declares, "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may proclaim the mighty deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were no people, but now you are God's people. Once you had not received mercy, but now you have received it." So the question that confronts us at the threshold of our third century of ministry is, who have we become through the experience of our yesterdays and how will this generation make the mighty deeds of God known? Because of what God has done for me in Jesus Christ, what am I being called to do? What of my faith will become a part of the living foundation on which Christ's church is being built? How is the Holy Spirit moving in our midst doing a new thing to make the kingdom of God visible?

Each of us are a part of the marvelous story of God's redeeming love for the world. It is a mystery that has no beginning because there was never a time that love never existed. And there will never be a time that love is not. We are God's own people, holy and beloved. And as God's own, we have a purpose that is meant to glorify him and him alone. While our names may fade as the years roll on, who we are and what we have done will not go unnoticed. You as well as I are tiny pieces of a picture that spans the ages and in our uniqueness we enhance the beauty of God's handiwork.

With grateful hearts be true to your calling. Celebrate your gifts as you use them to God's praise. Be open to those new things God brings into your life and appreciate your special roll in his marvelous plan.....

## "Like Living Stones"

I Peter 2:5 calls us to be "like living stones, built into a spiritual house...." That image of the church has been a watchword as we have moved closer to our 200th anniversary, and beyond. Many of you have been carrying stones in your pocket or purse as a reminder of Christ's presence with you and purpose for you. At the same time, our celebration calls us to consider who we are together.

We have asked you to bring a stone from your home to the church. The stone should be about three inches in diameter. Once we have collected the stones, they will be arranged artistically. Jim Antis will use his creative gifts in making an "objet d'art" (French for art object) to be placed in the prayer garden. This is symbolic of our spiritual identity as a community of living stones. We don't know yet what it will look like—a mosaic or something three dimensional? Jim is quite artistic, so we'll see where the Spirit leads him. Texture, shape and color don't matter, but we do ask that the size be about three inches or less across. You can bring one from each person in your household or one to represent the whole family.

## Annual Thanksgiving Dinner

Our Annual Thanksgiving Dinner will return. We've had to cancel 2 years due to Covid mandates. This year our meal will be served Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup> immediately following worship in Fellowship Hall. #### **Living Stones Activity**

#### **Materials Needed:**

- -Stones (paperweight size), smooth and clean, any shape, 1 per person
- -Paint brushes
- -Shirt, smock or apron to protect clothing
- -Poster, gouache or acrylic paints

#### -Newspaper

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Have the children study their rocks and find the best place to paint their names.
- 2. Let their creativity and imagination flow as they paint and decorate their personal "name stones."
- 3. Optional: glue felt to the bottom of the stone

#### **Faith Connection:**

Peter wrote about Jesus in the Bible as the "living stone" who was rejected by the people in power but approved and precious in God's eyes. We, too, are "living stones" (I Peter 2:4-5). We are God's building stones of the Church, with Jesus as the cornerstone. God wants to build Church with you and me. Let the stones with our names on them remind us of all the saints who have lived before us. We, too, should strive to become good and loving persons.
